# What to take on a CMC trip

- In the most basic terms, you should bring with you what will keep you *safe* and *comfortable*
- What you take depends on the type of trip
- If you have questions about the required gear for a given trip, call the leader
- It is always good to bring the 10 Essentials: map, compass, extra food and water, extra clothing, knife or multi-tool, flashlight (or headlamp), matches (or lighter), sunglasses/sunscreen, first aid kit

# What clothing should I wear?

- Base layers: synthetic materials like polypropylene or poly/lycra blends and traditional materials like wool are best for their breathability and insulative properties
- Insulation layer: fleece is a good option
- Outer layer: Gore-Tex, CoolMax, etc.
- Good footwear
- Cotton is not recommended

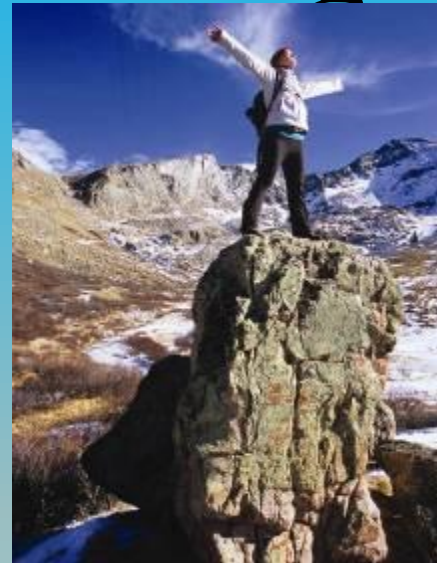
