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You can check your trip status by hovering over your name at the top of the main CMC Home Page and selecting the *My Activities* option from the dropdown. This brings up a page with the activities you have registered for along with your status--Registered (on the trip) or Waitlist and your position on the waitlist. If you are on the waitlist, keep checking since there are often cancellations.

Whether you are on a waitlist or a roster, if you decide to NOT go on a trip, please CANCEL AS SOON AS POSSIBLE. It may not seem necessary if you are on a waitlist, but many trips have a relatively high turnover shortly before the trip, so please cancel from waitlists as well to open up a spot for the next person.

BPX TIP OF THE MONTH

Updating Your CMC Profile and Setting Alerts and Notifications

Since it's the 1st anniversary of the new CMC Website, it's time to checkout/update your membership information if you haven't already done so. Start by logging into the CMC website, click on your name in the upper right corner, and select an option on the subsequent dropdown menu. Here is an explanation for some of the options:

- My Profile. Shows the Group and any Sections you belong to as well as badges you've earned, including Leader, Instructor, and Course. If any of this data is incorrect, contact the CMC Office since, except for Group, you cannot update this information. Note that Trip Leaders may view your profile to get an idea of your experience. (There were issues migrating profile information from the old website). There are also a several links to access the EDIT PROFILE Page.
- My Preferences. Brings up the EDIT PROFILE Page.
- My Activities. Shows the trips you are currently registered for and, if you are on the Waitlist, your position. It also shows the history of your past activities including maybe some from the old website.
- My Payments. Shows your payment history on the new CMC website.
- My Membership. Shows your membership renewal date, which at least currently is the date for both your CMC and BPX membership renewals even if you did not join/renew them at the same time.
- My Waiver. Provides a link to Re-sign your waiver.

EDIT PROFILE Page:

This page is broken down into several sections. You can expand a section by clicking on the + symbol on the right-hand side.

- Member Profile, where you can change your password, add your picture, enter a short biography, select activities you are interested in, etc. Clicking in the Activities box brings up a dropdown of activities to choose from.
- Contact Information, including your emergency contact.

- Email Newsletter Preferences for mailings from the Executive Director, Rucksack, Groups,
 Sections, etc. Currently setting these preferences may not work for all newsletters since some have not yet migrated to the new website, including the BPX Newsletter.
- Membership & Donation Preferences includes the option to set your Carpool Preferences.
- Alerts & Notifications Preferences. This is a really useful feature of the new website. Instead of having to continually peruse the CMC Calendar for trips and activities you are interested in, you can set up alerts to automatically notify you when a trip/activity is posted.
 - Frequency of alerts: as soon as posted/daily/weekly
 - Activities for alerts, like Backpacking, Hiking, Wilderness Medicine, etc. Clicking in the Activities box brings up a dropdown of activities to choose from.
 - Group(s) for the Activity alerts
 - o Courses, Clinics, & Seminars for alerts
 - Group(s) for the Course/Clinic/Seminar alerts

Make sure you select the <u>Save</u> button at the bottom of the page.
