


Bicycling News

Vrain. St. Vrain was born in St. Louis County, Missouri. The fur trade first brought St. Vrain to the southern rocky mountain region in 1824. St. Vrain and business partner Charles Bent established several forts on the Colorado plains between 1830 - 1840. One of these was Fort St. Vrain, built the confluence of this creek and the S. Platte River. From fur trapping and rading, he progressed to positions of pusiness, military and political promnence that made him one of the eading pioneers of the early west.
