2023: A Year of Challenge

As we enter our 113th year, the Colorado Mountain Club continues to look to the next opportunities and celebrate our successes, even as we face challenges. During the pandemic years we were remiss in reporting on our impact. We seek to remedy that with a summary report on fiscal year 2023. Through those years, we continued our work and in the last year we served a statewide membership of 5,800 outdoor enthusiasts, built over a hundred miles of new trail with Conservation stewardship crews, printed and sold books from CMC Press, got over 8,000 adults out on trips, educated 1,900 adult learners seeking their next adventure, and learned and played with over 6,000 young people in our Colorado community.

Throughout this transition of leadership, I aim to highlight our hard working staff and volunteers by showing the amazing work we do alongside the hardships we have overcome. As supporters of the Colorado Mountain Club, we know you understand that when storms pass through we assess and manage our risks, gather together, and keep moving forward whenever possible. 


SOURCES OF REVENUE Contribution 29.6%






This year membership has seen a great rise. With the efficacy of our new website and the reintroduction of in person New and Prospective Member Nights we are seeing a steady increase in membership.

New CMC Press Titles Added 2022/2023


