What do you do?

What do you do?

One of the trip participants trips and falls and cuts their hand on a rock. After some basic first aid, the bleeding stops and a nice bandage is securely applied.

What do you do now?

At a break, your rear sweep pulls you aside and lets you know one of the trip participants is really struggling with the pace. They are not sure of what to do.

What do you do?

You are at the trailhead and two people, who you believe were carpooling together, have not arrived yet. It is past the time advertised in your trip and some of the participants already there are eager to get going.

What do you do?

A few days after you post a trip, a CMC member asks you to contact them to discuss the trip. They recently had knee surgery, and although their doctor has cleared them for hiking, they have some concerns.

What do you do?

At the end of the break, a participant steps backwards to make room for a passing member and falls over a log. While trying to break the fall, the member puts out their arm and breaks their wrist.

What do you do?

About two hours into your trip, one of the participants states that the trip is not at all what they expected, and they are not going to continue this lame trip. They are going to do their own “fun” trip and not stay with the CMC group. What do you do?

While coming to a good rest stop, you see another group disappearing around the bend and observe trash scattered around where that group had just been gathered.

What do you do?

While on a break, one of your trip participants mentions that they underestimated how much food and water they would need. They are concerned they are getting low.

What do you do now?
