The Brain Injury Association of Colorado offers a fun-filled, inclusive event to inspire every participant, and challenge every ability while raising money to support those living with an injury to the brain in Colorado. The PPC relies heavily on community volunteers to help provide a safe and enjoyable event and Barr Trail check points assist hikers on their ascent to the summit. Help is needed at the No Name Creek, A-Frame, 2-mile, and 1-mile stations on September 12th. Interested volunteers need to be comfortable working at altitude for approximately 12 hours during the event. Upcoming Pikes Peak Group Classes

ARC Pro Intermediate Self Rescue

Sat, Jul 25, 2026 - Sun, Jul 26, 2026

This class reviews and expands upon self-rescue skills taught in the ARC Pro Basic Self Rescue class by teaching more skills applicable on single pitch climbing terrain, including top-managed sites. Students will learn how to escape a belay, perform a climber pick-off in a top-rope belay situation, assist a climber from above using hauling methods, and lower a climber from a top belay. The class consists of two outdoor field days for learning and practicing skills. Cost: Members \$105, Guests \$125.

PPG WTS - Intro to Backpacking Wed, Aug 12, 2026 - Wed, Aug 19, 2026

The PPG WTS - Introduction to Backpacking Course is the third and final course in the PPG Wilderness Trekking School curriculum. Learn all about it with two classes and an overnight backpacking trip. Backpacking is another way to experience the outdoors by carrying all the gear you need to travel, eat and sleep in pursuit of your adventure. It can take you to a distant location from the trailhead, help you enjoy an activity (summit attempt, alpine lake fishing, etc.) or serve as the main goal itself, such as hiking a long trail like the Colorado Trail. Carrying all the gear you need to travel, eat, sleep, stay dry, treat injuries, stay found, cook food, treat water, and enjoy yourself may be intimidating - but taken one step at a time - is very manageable. This class focuses on the basics in a lecture/discussion format and concludes with an overnight backpacking trip to put our new knowledge into action. Safety and fun are key elements of this class. Cost: Members \$45, Guests \$90.

ARC Pro Sport Lead Climbing Sat, Aug 22, 2026 - Sun, Aug 23, 2026

This class will teach participants the skills needed to safely lead sport climbs on their own, including basic leading technique, setting up a top-rope anchor, cleaning the anchor and rappelling or lowering down, advanced lead belaying, bailing off a route, climbing movement, and falling practice. It is taught over 2 full field days at a climbing crag. Cost: Members \$105, Guests \$125.

Basic Alpine Climbing Wed, Sep 9, 2026 - Sat, Sep 12, 2026

This course is the first course in the Pikes Peak Group's Basic Mountaineering School (BMS) curriculum. Basic Alpine Climbing consists of a set of skills that fill a gap between on or off-trail hiking and technical climbing. Skills include assessing hazards and decision making, traditional scrambling techniques, assessing and choosing off-trail routes in alpine/scrambling terrain. The PPG WTS - Wilderness Fundamentals Course is the prerequisite for this course. Students must have earned the "Wilderness Fundamentals course" badge or an equivalent CMC Wilderness Trekking School badge to be able to register for this course. Cost: Members \$45, Guests \$90.

PPG WTS - Wilderness Fundamentals Mon, Sep 14, 2026 - Sat, Sep 19, 2026

The Wilderness Fundamentals class is an introduction of important skills and back country knowledge to enable participants to independently plan and safely implement a day's outing in the great outdoors—away from civilization and all it provides. Wilderness Fundamentals is part of the Pikes Peak Group's Wilderness Trekking School (WTS). This class is a pre-requisite for many of our other PPG courses and will provide participants with a copy of *Mountaineering: Freedom of the Hills* that will be referenced in other courses! Make sure you have a good foundation of the basics before expanding your outdoor skillset. Cost: Members \$45, Guests \$90.

ARC Pro Advanced Self-Rescue Sat, Sep 26, 2026 - Sun, Sep 27, 2026

This class expands on the self-rescue skills taught in the Intermediate Self-Rescue class by teaching skills applicable on multi-pitch terrain. Students will learn how to rescue a follower by descending using tandem rappels; lower a climber from a top belay with a knot pass; and rescue a lead climber to include self-belayed climbing. Cost: Members \$45, Guests \$90.
