2024 Winter Camping School

Winter Camping School is for CMC members statewide who want to comfortably enjoy winter in a unique way, while learning new skills and staying safe and warm under moonlit skies. This school is recommended not only for backpackers, but anyone who intends to spend extended time in the backcountry in winter conditions, including snowshoers/skiers, mountaineers, and ice climbers.

WCS concentrates on the fundamental understanding, equipment, and techniques to keep warm in cold environments during an overnight stay. It covers topics such as how to dress, traveling efficiently, setting up camp, cooking, and sleeping comfortably.

This course has 3 lectures and 2 optional question-and-answer sessions. The first lecture is in-person at the AMC. The following lectures and Q-and-A sessions are online via Zoom meetings. The school will start on Tuesday, February 13th, at 6:20 PM. **Registration is open now and will close on Feb 12th at midnight. Register <u>HERE</u>. Be sure to read all of the details and follow all instructions.**

Attendance at all lectures is mandatory. They are on Feb 13th, 20th, and 27th, starting at 6:20 PM sharp. Optional Q-and-A sessions are on March 5th and 12th. There will be online quizzes required to progress in the school. Two required overnight trips are on March 9-10 and March 23-24.

Tuition is \$110 for Denver Group members and \$120 for CMC members from other groups. This fee includes all lectures, Q-and-A sessions, presentations, videos, a book, handouts, and access to online manuals.

Wilderness Trekking School (WTS) Starts April 2

Hiking in Colorado's mountains is fabulous recreation! Wilderness Trekking School (WTS) is for all – whether you want to bag a few 14ers or just want to enjoy the scenery. WTS is an excellent introduction to the CMC and a place to meet new friends. It's a comprehensive course on mountain day-hiking, with no prerequisites. It's also the CMC's largest school. Students are all ages, from 18 to 80.

If you're new to hiking, WTS provides an opportunity to learn how to travel safely and confidently in the backcountry. If you're already

an experienced hiker, WTS gives you a chance to review and enhance your skills and maybe fill in some gaps. It also fulfills one of the requirements for taking Backpacking School and Alpine Climbing School.

The course consists of streaming videos on your own, 5 Tuesday night small group meetings, 5 field days, and weekly homework (yes, really!). Students are divided into groups of 9-11 people, based on their preferred field day, with some consideration for fitness level.

The curriculum includes safe backcountry travel techniques and the opportunity to practice them in a supportive environment. Students plan and complete a CMC trip with their field group. Learn and practice new skills, make new friends, and become a safer, more confident backcountry traveler!

Tuition is \$170 until March 25 for current CMC Members. On and after March 26, tuition is \$190. **Registration** opens in mid-January and the course starts on Tuesday, April 2.

New Members: Have You Signed Up For Your First CMC Trip?

If not, consider a "New and Prospective Member Hike," designed to get you started. Bring guests! The trip leader will use the hike to answer your questions about hiking pace, gear, trip categories, transportation, etc. You will receive final instructions by email a few days before the trip.

Sign up by going to <u>cmc.org</u>, log in, search for any <u>"New</u> <u>Member" trips</u>, then click on the trip you want. Be sure to read the entire trip description!

If no New Member trip spots are available, remember that any CMC trip is available to you, so check out the entire

calendar. If you aren't sure what you can do, call the CMC office at 303-279-3080, or the trip leader (contact info in the trip details) for advice.

If your chosen trip is full, please add yourself to the waitlist. Waitlists usually clear and, if a spot becomes available, you will be moved automatically to the trip roster and receive an email notice. Bad weather does NOT automatically cause trip cancellation. Your trip leader will contact you about that.


Once the winter snow starts to accumulate, we'll keep right on hiking with our Beginner Snowshoe School. We supply the equipment! Be sure your hiking boots are waterproof, add some tall gaiters, and you will be good to go.

If you need to cancel from a trip, go to <u>cmc.org</u>, log in, click on **My Activities**, find the trip and click on it, then select "cancel." That allows someone else to move onto the roster. Please be conscientious about this - you don't want to be a "no show" and deny someone else the opportunity to participate.
