Conservation Corner

Proposed Dolores National Monument Update

Following the listening sessions held on the Western Slope this spring, on July 3, 2024, Colorado Senators Michael Bennet and John Hickenlooper released a statement regarding the proposed Dolores Canyon National Monument. They stated "it is clear that Coloradoans care deeply about this landscape and many want it permanently protected. We also recognize there are legitimate questions and the need for further discussion." The senators plan to continue working with public land users, Mesa and Montrose counties, local leaders and tribes to determine the "best tool" to use to protect the northern Dolores River canyon country. In response to concerns raised at the listening sessions, the senators outlined the following priorities. 1) The BLM and USFS will continue to manage the area. 2) There will be no entrance fees. 3) Grazing will continue. 4) Rimrocker Trail

will remain open to motorized use. 5) New trail development will continue for mountain biking. 6) All existing mining rights will be protected. 7) Existing water rights will remain protected. While the senators neither endorse nor reject a plan to move forward with a national monument, they have taken steps highlighting the need for conservation of this special area. What to Watch: Mountain Queen – The Summits of Lhakpa Sherpa



Mountain Queen is a critically acclaimed documentary that follows Lhakpa Sherpa's journey and extraordinary life. The film made its debut at the Toronto Film Festival and was recently featured at the Telluride Mountain Film Festival. On July 31, 2024, the film will be released on Netflix. Lhakpa Sherpa was raised in a small village in the Himalayas where her parents were yak farmers. The 48-year-old Nepalese woman grew up at time when girls were not educated. She still cannot read or write. Lhakpa Sherpa, a single mother of two girls, has worked as a housecleaner and at a Whole Foods in Connecticut. She is also a world class mountain climber, having summitted Mount Everest ten times, as well as making one successful ascent of K-2. Though her physical achievements are extraordinary, the film also covers her challenging personal life in detail. To pursue additional mountaineering goals, Lhakpa Sherpa has unsuccessfully sought sponsorships from several well-known, large outdoor retail companies, and even her employer, Whole Foods.
