"Travels on the Wilder Side"

Join us for the CMC WSG Annual Dinner at the Ute Indian Museum in Montrose featuring mountaineer and author Dave Cooper!

Dave Cooper has always been drawn to wild places, addicted to the raw beauty of Nature. Climbing and trekking have allowed Dave to visit some of the most spectacular places in various parts of the world.

Join Dave as he shares his experiences from the Andes of South America to the Brooks Range in Alaska, to Nepal, Africa and Europe. Sometimes mountaineering, sometimes rock and ice climbing and sometimes just wandering, Dave has attempted to capture the beauty of these locations in his photography.

Dave is the author of two Colorado guidebooks, <u>"Colorado Scrambles - Climbs Beyond the Beaten Path"</u>, and <u>"Colorado Snow Climbs - A Guide for All Seasons"</u>. For several years, he wrote the "Trail Mix" column for the Denver Post. His photography has been published in books, magazines and newspapers.

Charlie Winger sets record!

On July 5, 2025, long-time CMC leader Charlie Winger, age 88, reached the summit of Kilimanjaro, the tallest mountain in Africa at 19,341 feet. According to records about ascents of the peak, he is the 3rd oldest person in history to have successfully climbed it, and is only 11 months younger than the woman who holds the top age record. Contrary to the photo above, he was not carried up!

Charlie was part of a 9-person team supported by guides and porters. The climbers tackled the Lemosho Route, one of several possible trails up Kilimanjaro. Their ascent took place over a 7 day period, gaining over 11,600 feet in elevation, followed by a massive descent of 14,000 feet to a different trailhead during the final day and a half of the expedition. Charlie is no stranger to big peaks. He successfully climbed Kilimanjaro in 1986. Congrats Charlie!!

Stewardship Opportunities

As most of us are enjoying summer hikes and vacations, consider giving back to our beautiful landscapes by participating in a stewardship project. Michael Waters with the Ouray Trail Group attended our July council meeting and let us know about the need for help maintaining and restoring hiking trails. These are unique opportunities to work on overnight projects in designated wilderness areas. Motorized and mechanized vehicles and equipment are prohibited in wilderness and as a result these projects are supported with the help of pack animals. Overnight projects are scheduled in 8/2-3, 8/23-24, 8/30-31, 9/27-28 in special areas such as Wetterhorn. Colorado Canyons Association, the Grand Valley BLM Office's official volunteer partner, schedules interesting volunteer opportunities, as well as educational and interpretive events throughout the year. Several of our members enjoy the popular river cleanup events that take place while floating down stretches of the Colorado and Gunnison Rivers. During a recent cleanup event, an astonishing amount of trash was pulled from a 15-mile stretch of the Gunnison River south of Delta. The types of trash picked up included numerous pallets, a shopping cart, propane tanks, tents, etc. Keeping a watchful eye over the group of volunteers was a majestic bald eagle – another reminder of how important these projects are not only for recreationalists, but also for the wildlife that inhabit the area. What Other Outdoor Activities are You Interested In?



How Do I Find Out About New Trips After They're Posted?

The CMC website has a nice feature where you can get notified of new trips right after they're added or in a daily digest or in a weekly digest. Here's the steps for setting that up.

- 1) Login to your CMC account and click on "My Profile" under your name on the upper right.
- 2) Scroll down the page and click on "Edit Profile".
- Scroll down the page to "Alerts and Notifications Preferences" and select your desired "Update Frequency".
 You'll also need to choose at least one activity. See the example below.
- 4) Scroll down the page and click on "Save".
