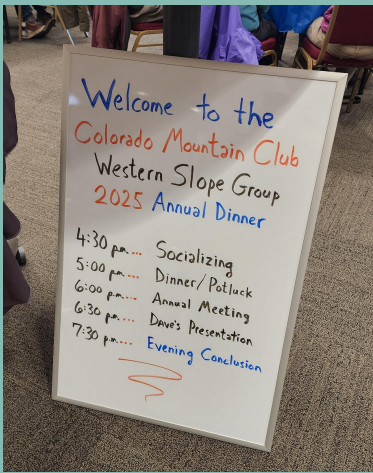

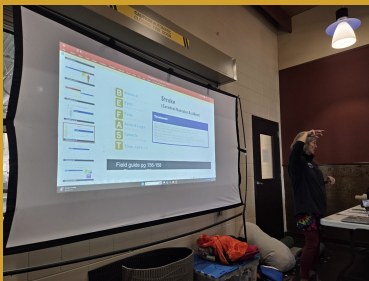
## November Fruita Wilderness First Aid (WFA) Class

Submitted by Daniel Glatter: "On November 21 and 22 of 2025, the Western Slope Group (WSG) of the Colorado Mountain Club (CMC) held a Wilderness First Aid (WFA) class in Fruita, Colorado. I had the privilege of teaching the class with two very knowledgeable and experienced instructors, Marian Heesaker Clapp, and Jenni Nebgen. Nominally, I was the Lead Instructor, but Marian and Jenni really carried the bulk of the instruction of the class. We had 11 students, some of whom were CMC members and others who were not. The class was 16 hours in length. The students received classroom instruction, as well as practice with wilderness emergency and medicine scenarios. The students appeared to be engaged and interested in the topics that were presented. They asked many good questions. Also, for the non-members taking the class, we gave a short summary of the benefits of WSG CMC membership. Marian, Jenni and I are looking forward to teaching the next WSG CMC WFA class in Montrose in May of 2026!"

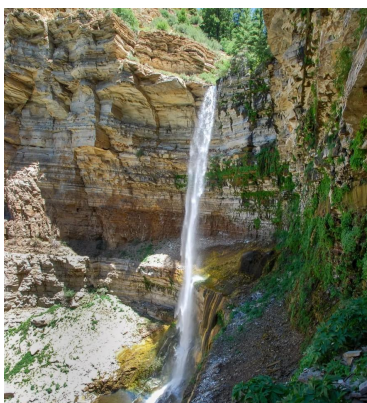

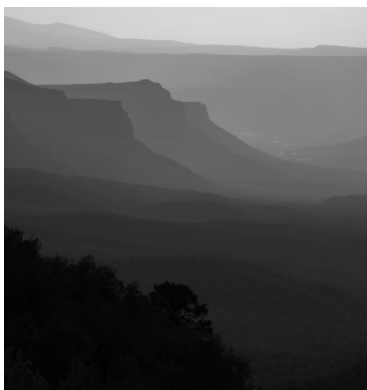

## Update on Wild for Good Presentation



Erin Riccio, Advocacy Director for Wilderness Workshop, generously accepted my invitation to come to Grand Junction and make a presentation on the Wild for Good Campaign. On November 20th, we learned about ten landscapes in western Colorado that are worthy of permanent protection. It was also an opportunity to meet and talk with staff from Wilderness Workshop, Colorado Wildlands Project, The Wilderness Society and Western Colorado Alliance. Several of our champion CMC trip leaders, conservation advocates and members attended, as well as members from other organizations. The Director of Colorado Wildlands Project, Soren Jespersen has

spent 20 years on the ground exploring our beautiful western Colorado landscapes and identifying areas that should be protected. ## How Do I Find Out About New Trips After They're Posted?

The CMC website has a nice feature where you can get notified of new trips right after they're added or in a daily digest or in a weekly digest. Here's the steps for setting that up.

- 1) Login to your CMC account and click on "My Profile" under your name on the upper right.
- 2) Scroll down the page and click on "Edit Profile".
- 3) Scroll down the page to "Alerts and Notifications Preferences" and select your desired "Update Frequency". You'll also need to choose at least one activity. See the example below.
