Conservation Corner

Wolves and Thinking Like a Mountain



At the end of last year, ten wolves from Oregon were released in Colorado because of a vote by residents in favor of reintroduction. Throughout the process it was apparent that the mythical wolf provokes both political and emotional responses. Aldo Leopold, in his essay *Thinking Like A Mountain*, reflects on a time when he was "full of trigger-itch" believing that the extermination of wolves would result in more deer for hunters and better financial returns for cattle ranchers. His perspective changed when, after a session of "pumping lead" into a pack of wolves, he watched the fire die in the eyes of an old wolf. It was then that he realized "only the mountain has lived long enough to objectively listen to the howl of a wolf." In other words, it is best to trust nature to keep ecosystems in balance. Historically, the wolf has been a human centered controversy based upon differing individual values. As a society, let's hope we can grow to understand our place in nature and peacefully coexist with these magnificent animals. Click here if you wish to read Aldo Leopold's famous essay. Protect the Dolores Movement

Two decades of discussion and collaboration regarding the Dolores River led Dolores, San Miguel and Montezuma counties, as well as the Ute Mountain Ute tribe, conservation groups and a local rancher to request that a portion of the Dolores River corridor be protected. Colorado Senator Michael Bennet introduced legislation to designate a National Conservation Area in order to protect 68,000 acres within those counties. Additionally, there is a movement to protect the Dolores River Canyon Country as a national monument. This would result in protecting lands in Mesa and Montrose counties, as well as complementing the existing NCA proposal. The Colorado Wildlands Project/Wilderness Workshop is leading this effort and notes that the Dolores River Canyon Country includes over 500,000 acres of important wildlife habitat and cultural sites. Legendary CMC Climber Janet Johnson's Death Reexamined after Recent Discovery of her Camera on Aconcagua



Janet Johnson was a CMC member decades ago and one of the first 20 women to summit all of Colorado's fourteeners. Fifty years ago, Janet Johnson was part of an 8-person team attempting to climb Aconcagua. She was last seen alive on the Polish Glacier. Contradictory statements from members of the climbing team regarding her disappearance have led to a range of theories about the cause of death - from natural causes to allegations of foul play. Recently a porter discovered a 50-year-old, 35 mm camera bearing Janet Johnson's name and Denver address while he was climbing Aconcagua.
