## Avalanche Terrain Avoidance (ATA) January 25 Recorded Lecture & February 8 Field Day at the Grand Mesa Lodge

Linda Lawson from the Denver Group will be traveling to the Western Slope to hold the CMC's Avalanche Terrain Avoidance (ATA) field day on Saturday, February 8. It will be held at the Grand Mesa Lodge. A required zoom lecture was held on January 25. If you missed that, you can still register for ATA through February 7 and receive a recording of the zoom lecture. The recording must be watched prior to the field day.

ATA is a valuable course that teaches how to recognize and avoid avalanche prone terrain. It is required for leaders who lead trips to snow-covered, non-avalanche terrain (with the exception of downhill skiing resorts). Trip leader renewal for ATA is required every 5 years with the field day as optional on renewal. Contact WSGofCMC@gmail.com to register.

### **Two New National Monuments Have Been Designated**



President Biden set a record for conserving more land and waters than any other president (674 million acres.) Just before the end of his term, President Biden created two new national monuments in California covering more than 800,000 acres. The Chuckwalla National Monument includes 624,000 acres south of Joshua Tree National Monument in southeastern California. The area includes several sacred Indigenous sites, as well as 50 species of rare animals and plants. Located at the junction of the Mojave, Sonoran and Colorado deserts, the area possesses astonishing biodiversity. In northern California, the Sáttítla Highlands National Monument covers over 224,000 acres. The area has been damaged by energy and mining extraction, along with poor logging practices. The effort to protect the Sáttítla Highlands National Monument was initiated by the Pit River Tribe. This landscape is the ancestral homeland of the Modoc People and Pit River Tribe.

#### Passage of The EXPLORE Act

During the ending weeks of the 118th Congress, some conservation policies made it to the finish line. Of particular interest is the Expanding Public Lands Outdoor Recreation Experience (EXPLORE) Act which received broad, bipartisan support. The passage of this Act means the accessibility to our public lands will be increased and enhanced, so that millions of people can continue to enjoy outdoor recreation. The legislation promises to improve public land access including for those with disabilities, modernize technology to enhance the visitor experience, streamline the permitting process, restore campgrounds, and protect rock climbing in iconic places.

#### How Do I Find Out About New Trips After They're Posted?

The CMC website has a nice feature where you can get notified of new trips right after they're added or in a daily digest or in a weekly digest. Here's the steps for setting that up.

1) Login to your CMC account and click on "My Profile" under your name on the upper right.

2) Scroll down the page and click on "Edit Profile".

3) Scroll down the page to "Alerts and Notifications Preferences" and select your desired "Update Frequency". You'll also need to choose at least one activity. See the example below.

4) Scroll down the page and click on "Save".
