Conservation Corner

WHAT A YEAR IT HAS BEEN AND WHERE DO WE GO FROM HERE?

The assault on our public lands at the federal level has been disastrous, impacting public lands, wildlife and communities. There is a clear lean in favor of the fossil fuel industry. At the congressional level, the theme has been “permitting reform” legislation. There are a series of bad bills designed to undercut protections for our public lands. Examples include the Fix Our Forests Act, a proposal to gut protections for our national forests and grasslands. Another example is the SPEED Act. This proposed act would cripple NEPA (National Environmental Policy Act) - our nation’s law that allows individuals and groups to have a voice and defend against logging and other extractive industries.

At the same time, terrible ideas and poisonous policies are moving forward through our federal agencies, at the direction of the executive branch. This planned, systematic dismantling of policies essential to public lands include attempts to rescind the Roadless Rule – a rule established in 2001 to protect 60 million acres from development and roads. Also, under attack is the Public Lands Rule which defines conservation as a “use” or land management action. There is a proposal to rescind from the Endangered Species Act, the inclusion of “habitat” in the definition of “harm.”

Although it is hard to imagine, this moment will pass. We must fight back now to see another day with a different congress, a different administration. We deserve a voice and have a voice in the decisions that are made impacting public lands. Never forget that these are our lands. And collectively, we have so much power as voters. Small acts can have a big impact. Comment writing, writing letters, making phone calls and attending public hearings may not seem very exciting. But as the year ends, take a moment to reflect upon the amount of time you spent this year outdoors enjoying our public lands and connecting with nature and friends. Please consider making a pledge to yourself, to the landscapes and wildlife, and to the next generations, to invest a fraction of those many hours spent on public lands giving back in the upcoming year. Our silence right now is the death of public lands.

How Do I Find Out About New Trips After They're Posted?

The CMC website has a nice feature where you can get notified of new trips right after they're added or in a daily digest or in a weekly digest. Here's the steps for setting that up.

- 1) Login to your CMC account and click on "My Profile" under your name on the upper right.
- 2) Scroll down the page and click on "Edit Profile".
- 3) Scroll down the page to "Alerts and Notifications Preferences" and select your desired "Update Frequency". You'll also need to choose at least one activity. See the example below.
- 4) Scroll down the page and click on "Save".
