Conservation Corner

The Public Land Rule

Recently, the Department of Interior stated that the BLM Public Lands Rule will be rescinded. The rule was announced last June after years of public comment and

consideration, and research and planning by the BLM. 92% of the comments received by the BLM supported the Public Lands Rule. The conservation community was excited and hopeful about the Public Lands Rule because it gave the issue of conservation, healthy landscapes and wildlife habitat equal weight with other uses considered by the BLM in implementing its multiple use policy. Historically, before the enactment of the Public Lands Rule, the BLM's multiple use policy favored extractive industries, grazing, motorized use and other activities. This is just one more unfortunate setback for our public lands. The "good news" is that a lawsuit was filed last year by opponents of the Public Lands Rules and in response, several conservations groups filed a motion to intervene. The matter is still pending before a federal court.

How Do I Find Out About New Trips After They're Posted?

The CMC website has a nice feature where you can get notified of new trips right after they're added or in a daily digest or in a weekly digest. Here's the steps for setting that up.

1) Login to your CMC account and click on "My Profile" under your name on the upper right.

2) Scroll down the page and click on "Edit Profile".

3) Scroll down the page to "Alerts and Notifications Preferences" and select your desired "Update Frequency". You'll also need to choose at least one activity. See the example below.

4) Scroll down the page and click on "Save".
