The WFA course teaches students the skills to anticipate risks and hazards, identify medical, traumatic, environmental problems, recognize lifethreatening issues, initiate basic care and deliver a cohesive report. The curriculum forces students to think creatively, adapt to ever changing situations, and learn valuable leadership, decision making, and communication skills to use in the outdoors.

#### **Conservation Corner**

# President of the Wilderness Society's Recent Visit to the Western Slope

Earlier this week Tracy Stone-Manning, President of the Wilderness Society and former Director of the BLM, along with Nada Wolff Culver, former Principal Deputy Director of the BLM held a fireside chat in Carbondale to discuss the future of our public lands.

Tracy emphasized the impact made by public outcry over the proposed public lands sell off. Collectively, people from all walks of life have shown they fiercely love public lands. Senator Hickenlooper received 5,000 phone calls and 26,000 emails about the proposed sell off of public lands. This is just the beginning of a movement we are building together. She described our public lands as "America's best act."

Tracy perceives the current threats to public lands as unique for several reasons. First, they are relentless. Second, nothing this administration has done is about the future. She believes that Congress is going to need to pass some legislation that is positive about the future. Colorado has two great examples of bipartisan bills – the Colorado Outdoor Recreation and Economy (CORE) Act and the Gunnison Outdoor Resource Protection (GORP) Act. The CORE Act proposes protections for the San Juan Mountains, the Continental and Thompson Divides, and the Curecanti National Recreation Area. The GORP Act is an effort to protect the Gunnison Basin. It is worthwhile letting our lawmakers know that we are in favor of the passage of these bills and thanking them. (Senator Hickenlooper, Senator Bennet and Representative Neguse are sponsoring the CORE Act. Senator Hickenlooper, Senator Bennet and Representative Hurd are sponsoring the GORP Act.)

Finally, aggressive elimination of jobs in the federal agencies amounts to the denigration of the idea of public service. She emphasized the importance of thanking federal agency workers that we may run into while enjoying our time on public lands – such as a park service employee collecting fees at a toll booth.

People make lifetime memories on public lands and are deeply connected to public lands. Most Americans share this common value that these places matter. Convincing someone to believe in a value is the hard part, so the hard part is over.


### **WSG Facebook Group**

#### How Do I Find Out About New Trips After They're Posted?

- 2) Scroll down the page and click on "Edit Profile".
