Bike Trips for May

Hello fellow cyclists,

I am looking forward to a great cycling season, which begins the first Friday in May and runs through the last Friday in September. Kirsten Tollefsen, Pete Spandau, Dennis Baumfalk, Bob Barday, Jerry Rowe, Scott Kramer, and Gail Wells will be organizing and scheduling their favorite rides. So hopefully there will be more variety and some new outings.

About 15 to 30 bikers participate weekly, riding on bike paths & quiet city streets throughout the Denver & Boulder areas. Sometimes we go west to Summit County. Occasionally we encounter some hills and gravel trails.

The Friday morning rides are finished with an optional lunch at a nearby restaurant or a picnic where you bring your own food and drink.

Currently there will be two styles of riding groups:

Hares and Terrapins. Hares ride approximately 20 to 30 miles at a speed of 10 to 15 mph. Terrapins ride approximately 10 to 15 miles at a speed slower with more stops.

The essential items for participating are plenty of water, necessary tools to repair a flat tire (replacement tube for your tire size,) appropriate clothing for changes in the weather, ID and a medical card. Wearing a helmet is mandatory.

The meeting time is usually 8:30 am with departure at 9:00 am. Guests are allowed with the signing of a waiver form. Guests may participate in two of our activities before joining the RMOTHG section and the Denver group of CMC.

RMOTHG Vance's Cabin Trip Announcing the Lottery for the 2026 Trip!



Trip Dates: Feb 25-27, 2026 (Wed-Fri)

Registration Lottery: May 1-15, 2025

RMOTHG members interested in joining the trip can email your name, email, and phone number to <u>dschweissing@gmail.com</u> by no later than May 15th. We will compile the names and run a lottery during the second half of May and notify you of your status by the first week of June. If you have been selected to participate in the trip, we will extend you an "offer" via the CMC website, which will allow you to pay for the trip and finalize your registration. Trip applicants who are not selected in the lottery will be waitlisted and contacted in the event that a registered trip participant cancels out of the trip.

Cost: \$85.52

This is a three-day, two-night hut trip to Vance's Cabin, located north of Leadville. We have reserved the entire cabin, which includes fourteen beds. **Registration is limited to RMOTHG members only.**

Itinerary is under development and review. Distance and elevation encompass route to and from hut on Day 1 and Day 3. One or more optional day hikes, snowshoeing on or off trail near the hut, will be offered on Day 2.

The trip elevation begins at 10,424' and peaks at 11,160' before descending to Vance's Cabin at 10,980'. The distance to the cabin is a 3.1 mile snowshoe. The route into Vance's Cabin follows a marked ski trail beginning at the base of Ski Cooper. It follows rolling terrain and gentle climbs into the hut.

There are no avalanche dangers in this area. We will enjoy beautiful views during the day and stargazing at night.

EASY WEEKLY HIKES WILL START IN MAY!

"Walking Wounded Rehab Hikes" are finally starting, come May. These late Monday afternoon meanders will be offered most weeks throughout the summer ... and anybody who's into a short-and-easy, ambling hike should feel welcome!

These outings are meant for anybody who loves being outdoors but wants to SLOWLY work their way back to fitness, or anyone who just feels like taking it easy that week and enjoying a short walk outside. Say hello to a social group of folks who are jonesing to get OUT THERE despite everything that life has thrown at us -- maybe check out flowers and trees along the way or even take a few pics of the view ... and breathe a little more freely.

If you find yourself wondering if even the 'Ascending Hike' series may be a little too aggressive for you, or you simply want to get out for very light hike for fun and to de-stress, *regardless* of any issues, then our 'Walking Wounded' Rehab Hikes are meant for you.

As long as you're good to go (and, if injured, have a thumbs-up from your physical therapist or doctor), then come join your hike leader, Karen Baldwin (who has, for too long, been in the same boat) for an EASY, SHORT, CASUAL-PACE outing that's pretty much on-the-flat without a lot of elevation change ... a walk on which NOBODY has to worry about holding up the group, because we're all right there with ya, and don't mind waiting.

After a short session of stretches (or whatever rehab exercises help you), we'll head up the trail. And since we're the 'walking wounded,' not the 'walking dead,' we'll take an easy amble up the trail at maybe a couple of mph ... turtle slow, but not DEAD slow."
